

How to use the **Mail Preference Service**

Sometimes you might get a lot of junk mail through your door.

It might come from companies trying to sell you things or charities asking you to donate money to them.

This junk mail is called unsolicited mail. This means you didn't ask it to be sent to you.



The Mail Preference Service can tell companies that you do not want to get junk mail.

It is a free service but you have to register first.



MPS can stop junk mail for the person that used to live at your address before you.

MPS can stop junk mail for someone that has died.



MPS can't stop junk mail that is sent from another country.

MPS can't stop junk mail from companies that you have bought stuff from before
